

PAPER ROLLING TECHNIQUE BY TRACY

MATERIALS REQUIRED

Pattern Paper

Double Sided Tape

Ruler and Cutting Knife

Ink - optional



There's no rule that says you have to do the paper rolling exactly as I (try) to describe it :
If you find a simple way to complete this technique, then that's the way to do it for you!

LETS GET STARTED ...

Cut strips of pattern paper in various heights.

Mine was 3.5cm, 5cm and 6.5cm. You don't have to have it different heights just depends on how you want your end result to look like

Double side tape on the top and bottom of each strip – *I just find it easier to do this now than when it is cut into little pieces*



Peel around 3cm off the top layer from the double sided tape (both sides) to expose the stick tape.

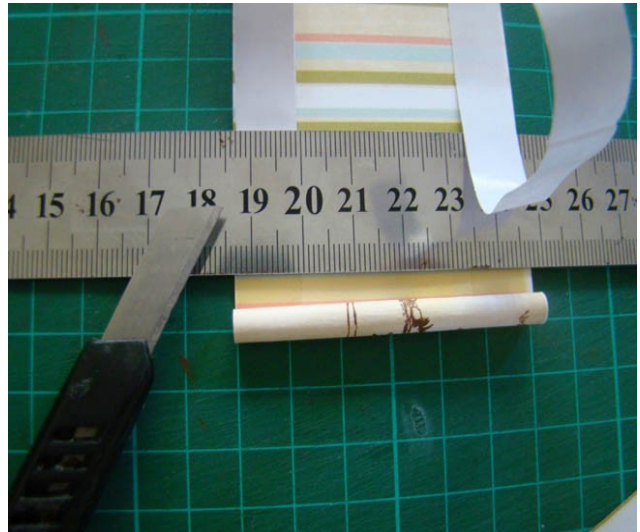
Then roll pattern paper approx 2-3 times over the exposed tape.

Cut your roll off the strip then apply double sided tape to stop it from unravelling.

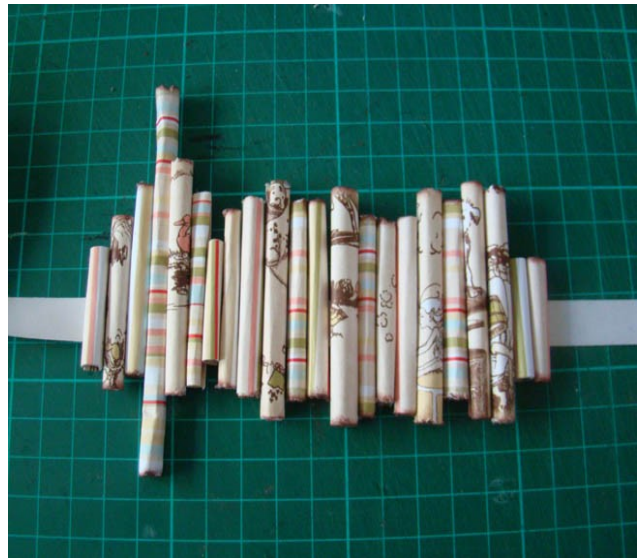
You can use a skewer to help you get an even roll then pull out once completed each one. *I found my skewer didn't stick to the double sided tape*

Keep doing this until you have enough rolls.

I have also distressed the ends with my cutting knife and then inked – the choice is yours



Once you have all your strips rolled, place them in position onto double sided tape then attach to layout.
